Contact with Rick Dyer can be made by a private citizen or by the town. There is more likelihood of some type of enforcement action if the contact is made as a "complaint" rather than as a "request for technical assistance", so the town should avoid this path if possible. The best way for the town to handle this would be for the SB to request that Rick take a look and offer his assistance. Failing that, you could file a citizen complaint, Rick would come to inspect, and then he would inform the town about what he had found, and what corrections might be needed, with an associated deadline for compliance.
